Minimum Safety
Equipment Required for

## the Size and Type of your Pleasure Craft

The Small Vessel Regulations set out the minimum safety equipment required on board a pleasure craft according to its type and length.

To determine the length of your pleasure craft, refer to your manufacturer's product information or measure it yourself – from the forward end of the foremost outside surface of the hull shell to the after end of the aftermost outside surface of the hull shell.

To find out the minimum safety equipment requirements for your pleasure craft, select the appropriate category:

Human-powered pleasure craft (including canoes, kayaks, rowboats and rowing shells)

Personal watercraft (PWC)

Paddleboats and watercycles

Sailboards and kiteboards

Sail and powered pleasure craft up to 6 m (19'8")

Sail and powered pleasure craft over 6 m and up to 9 m (19'8"-29'6")

Sail and powered pleasure craft over 9 m and up to 12 m (29'6"-39'4")

Sail and powered pleasure craft over 12 m and up to 24 m (39'4"-78'9")

Sail and powered pleasure craft up to 24 m (78'9")

Requirements for pleasure craft involved in competition

In the case of any discrepancy between the information on this page and the *Small Vessel Regulations*, the <u>formal regulatory text</u> shall remain the final authority.

## **BOOM Sailing Camp**

BRLA will once again be hosting the OSA BOOM Sailing Camp on Cow Island for two weeks this coming summer. Certified instructors will offer White Sail Levels I-III; we'll be sailing Laser Picos.

Sailing Camp will run for two weeks July 4-8 [5 days] and August 2-5 [4 days, no classes on the holiday Monday]. Students can enroll in either one week or both. We also have an option to offer adult lessons during the evening on either week.

Registration details can be found in the attached form, which will also be available on the BRLA web site. Please pass it on to anyone who might be interested. Children must be 8 years of age to take sailing lessons.

Registrations are taken in the following order: Returning Sailors; Siblings of returning sailors; Open Registration [first come / first served -- I'll post to the BRLA Members list in a week or so]. Please return your completed form as soon as possible to reserve your place.
